

## ABOUT KENNEDY PHARMACY SERVICES

Kennedy University Hospital (KUH) is offering a postgraduate year one (PGY1) pharmacy residency training program that is currently under candidate status by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP).

The Department of Pharmacy provides a comprehensive program of patient care services, including medication distribution, clinical services, drug information, educational services, and research for all patient populations. These services will be rendered via a centralized main pharmacy in each hospital location, which will provide all pharmaceutical products.

Automation plays a huge role in medication management. Automated distribution cabinets are located in most ancillary areas to provide medication storage, security, and assist in medication distribution. Some examples of our technology includes a McKesson Robot, MedCarousel, PacMed, AcuDose cabinets, Omnicell anesthesia carts, narcotic tracking software (NarcStation), order scanning software (MedComm) and IV pumps with 'smartpump' technology. We recently implemented bed-side barcoded medication administration and upgraded our medical record charts via ImageWorks. Computerized physician order entry (CPOE) is currently being instituted.

Prospective residents will be evaluated on the following materials and ranked accordingly. Please provide materials no later than January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 via PhORCAS:

- Official transcript (most recent college transcript) from an ACPE-accredited College of Pharmacy
- ASHP matching program number
- Letter of intent
- Three (3) letters of recommendation with at least one from a preceptor during clerkship
- Interview (on-site preferred)
- Application
- Curriculum Vitae

All prospective residents must be licensed in the State of New Jersey by August 15<sup>th</sup>
